Sarah is one of the founding members of SWEP Greater Philadelphia, which is celebrating its 10th anniversary. SWEP is delighted to honor a woman whose achievements and guidance have helped pave the way for many other women interested in pursuing environmental and business careers.

Sarah Hetznecker is a hydrogeologist and licensed Professional Geologist (PG) who has worked in the environmental investigation, remediation and compliance industry for over 22 years. Ms. Hetznecker is currently President of Mesa Environmental Sciences, Inc., a consulting firm she co-founded that specializes in customized solar photovoltaic system design and installation. On May 23, 2005, Ms. Hetznecker was honored as one of Pennsylvania's Best 50 Women in Business for 2005, by the Commonwealth's Secretary of Community and Economic Development. This award program recognizes the impact that women business owners and business leaders have in creating jobs and building communities in Pennsylvania. In addition to Sarah's contribution to the environmental profession, she finds time to serve her community as Trustee for the Schuylkill Center for Environmental Education whose mission is to promote the preservation and improvement of our natural environment by fostering appreciation, understanding and responsible use of the ecosystem.
